





### **GENDER OF LITTLES**








### **AGES OF BIGS**


## **GENDER OF BIGS**





#### WHITEY ELLSWORTH & ADAM FUNK - MATCHED IN 1989

Big Brother Whitey Ellsworth and Little Brother Adam Funk were matched in 1989 when Adam was 10 years old. Adam's mom, recognizing the need for a positive male influence in his life, enrolled him in Big Brothers Big Sisters. Whitey, a father of four seeking to make a community impact, became Adam's mentor. Their Saturdays were spent in Whitey's woodshop, where Adam learned valuable skills and gained insights into business ownership. Whitey's influence inspired Adam to own his own business. Their bond extended beyond the official match with Whitey present for significant life moments. Adam acknowledges Whitey as a pivotal role model stating, "I would not be who I am today if you weren't a part of my life."

#### JOHN LOMBARDI AND PABLO JUAREZ - MATCHED IN 2016

Big Brother John Lombardi and Little Brother Pablo Juarez were matched in February 2016 when Pablo's family, new to Green Bay after immigrating from Mexico, sought a male role model through Big Brothers Big Sisters. Retired and inspired by his father-in-law, Whitey's, experience as a Big, John embraced the opportunity to make a difference. John helped Pablo learn English, attended basketball games, and shared cultural experiences. Pablo later joined the Navy with John's guidance and wisdom as a Veteran. The two stayed in touch during his service. Pablo, expressing deep appreciation, credited Big Brothers and Big Sisters for introducing him to John declaring, "The only way to describe it is I love you and thank you very much for your sacrifice."

## **NEW SITE-BASED INITIATIVES**





In 2023, we kicked off The Big Club, a new collaboration between Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northeast Wisconsin (BBBSNEW) & the Boys & Girls Club of Greater Green Bay. This group mentoring initiative pairs volunteer mentors with children at BGCGGB offering guidance, friendship, and positive behavior modeling. The program addresses the unique challenges faced by youth in disadvantaged communities, providing crucial support and intervention. A caring adult role model through The Big Club becomes a vital protective factor in fostering resilience and positive outcomes for these young individuals. This program is curriculum-based with a BBBS staff member who facilitates each session.

## WORKPLACE MENTORING AT Breakthrough.

In the Fall of 2023, we kicked off our new workplace mentoring program at Breakthrough, a U.S. Venture company in Green Bay. This new program allows kids from Howe Elementary to be bussed to the Breakthrough building near Lambeau Field at the end of the school day. They then get to spend about an hour with their Bigs during the end of their workday. The matches play games, go outside, make crafts, and other fun activities together! As of March 2024, we have more than 19 matches in this program!
